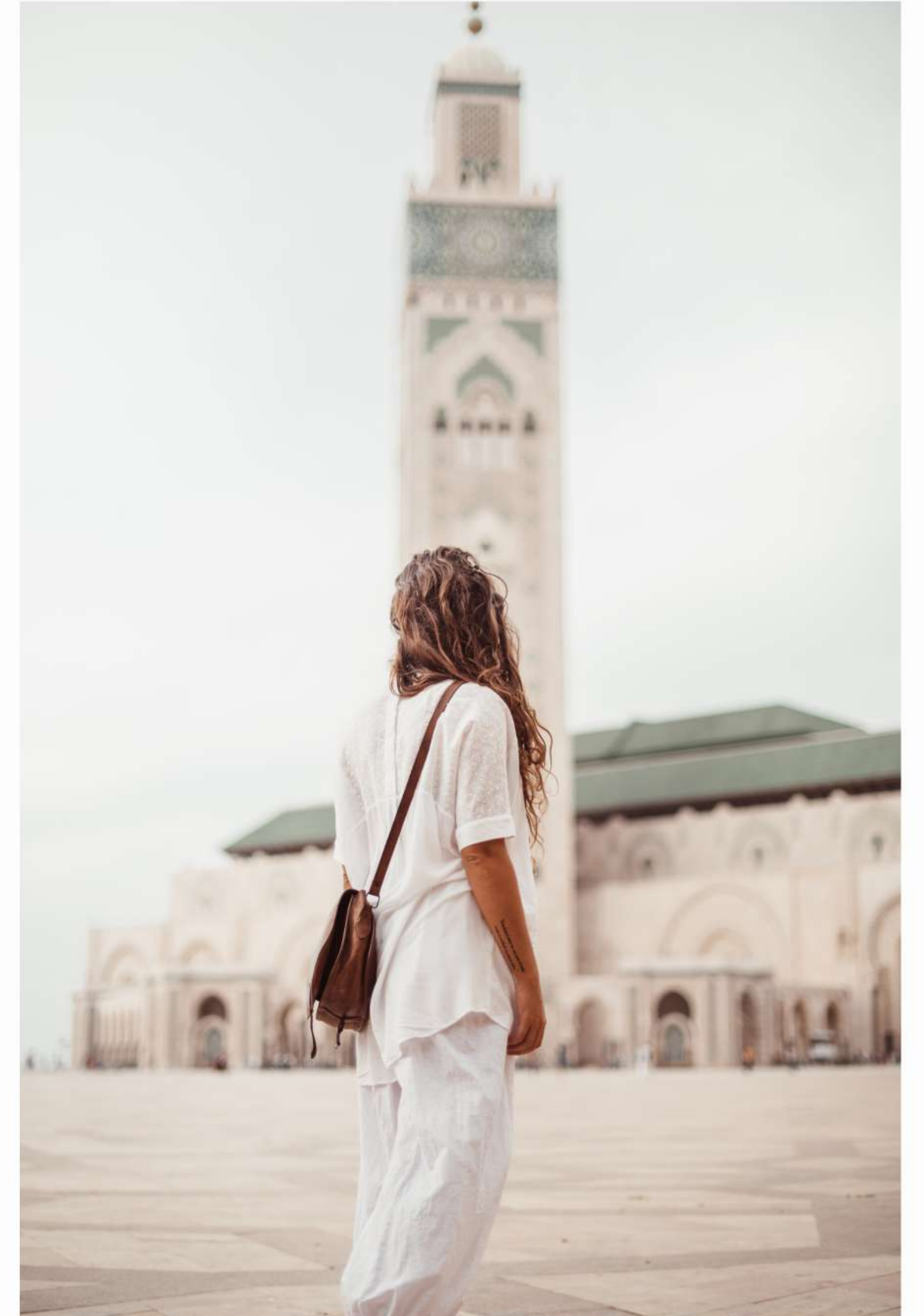

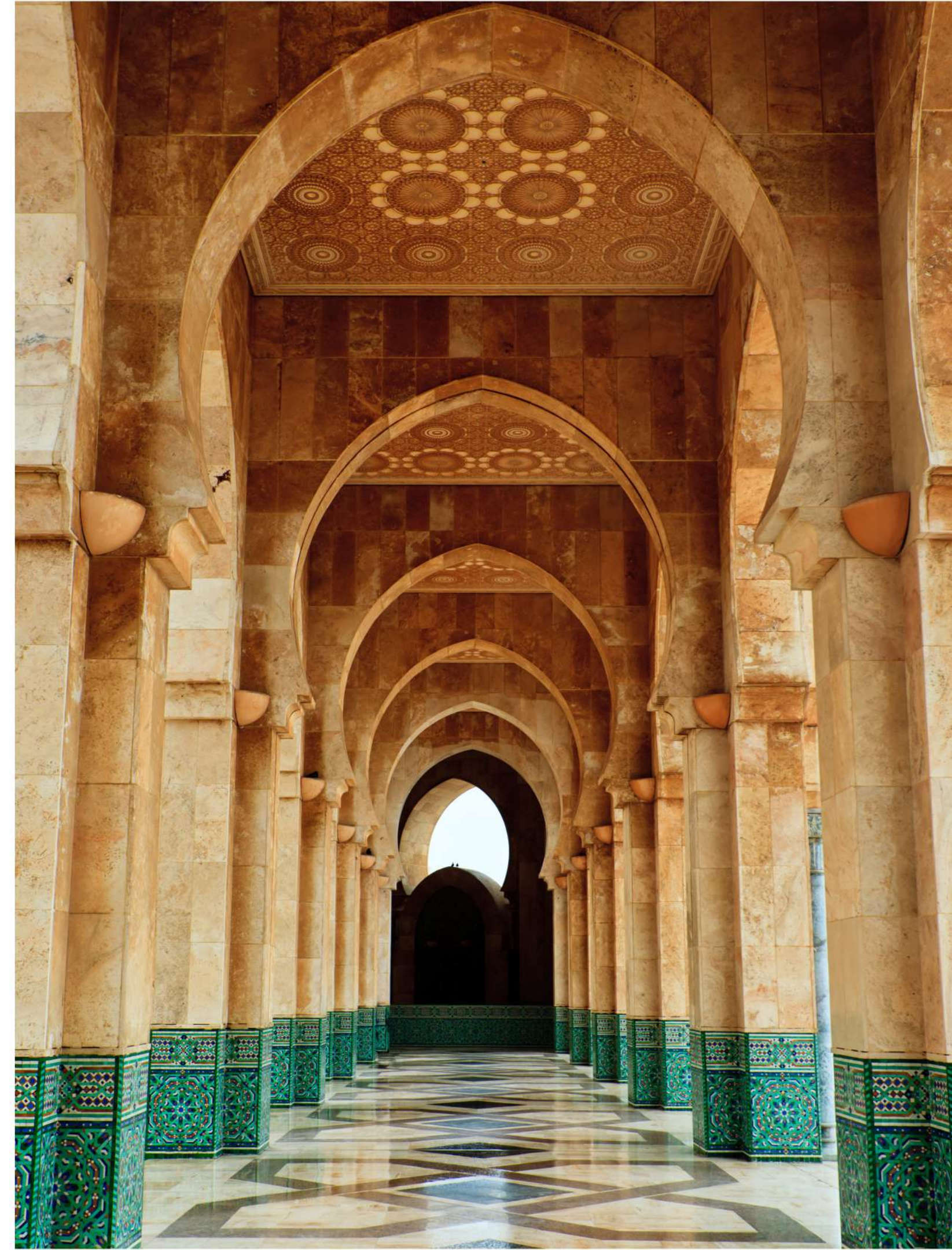

DAY 2

Hassan II Mosque - Ain Diab Beaches - Art Deco Houses - Sacré Cœur Church

Casablanca, economic heart of the Kingdom, lives at a frenetic pace. Business and art go side by side here, often intermingling. It is here, above all, that tones and trends are set. Why is it that so many artists have found their inspiration in Casablanca? Perhaps the contrasting curves of its Art Deco buildings are enough to cast a spell over them.

The richness of the city's architectural heritage is sufficient in itself to call forth the image of a city where time has no hold. Charged with history yet resolutely turned towards the future, this most cosmopolitan of cities, where every nationality is represented, parades its modernity for all to see. The Mosque Hassan II is the largest Mosque of the world after the one of la Mecque and Medine.

Medina of Fez - Medersa Attarine - Tanneries - Karaouine & Andalusia Mosques - Nejjarine Square & craftsmen district - Merinid Tombs - Exterior of the Royal Palace. Fascinating Fez...

When the most imperial of Moroccan cities welcomes its guests, it shares with them the most precious art of living. An open-air museum, Fez rivals Venice, Florence and Athens as a living universal heritage. The refinement of its palaces, the richness of its museums, the grandeur of its medersas which sheltered the greatest scholars of the Golden Age, the profusion of its mosques as many tributes to the greatness of God are, for the lovers of culture and arts, an invitation to the discovery constantly renewed.

Spiritual and cultural center of the Kingdom, city of a thousand facets, Fez remains intact in its splendor. Its priority is to preserve its traditions and the soul of its old stones. Its medina, classified as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO, has kept its authenticity and original character for over 1,200 years.

Fez has inherited Arab nobility, Andalusian refinement, Jewish ingenuity and Berber tenacity. Its brilliant past, the respect of its tangible and intangible heritage and its aristocratic character, contribute to the obvious fascination that the city exerts on today's visitor. The jewels of Fes El Bali... The entire ancient city, Fez-el-Bali, is a real open-air museum. It contains countless masterpieces in its 9400 streets.

- 2 nights at the Fairmont La Marina Rabat Salé

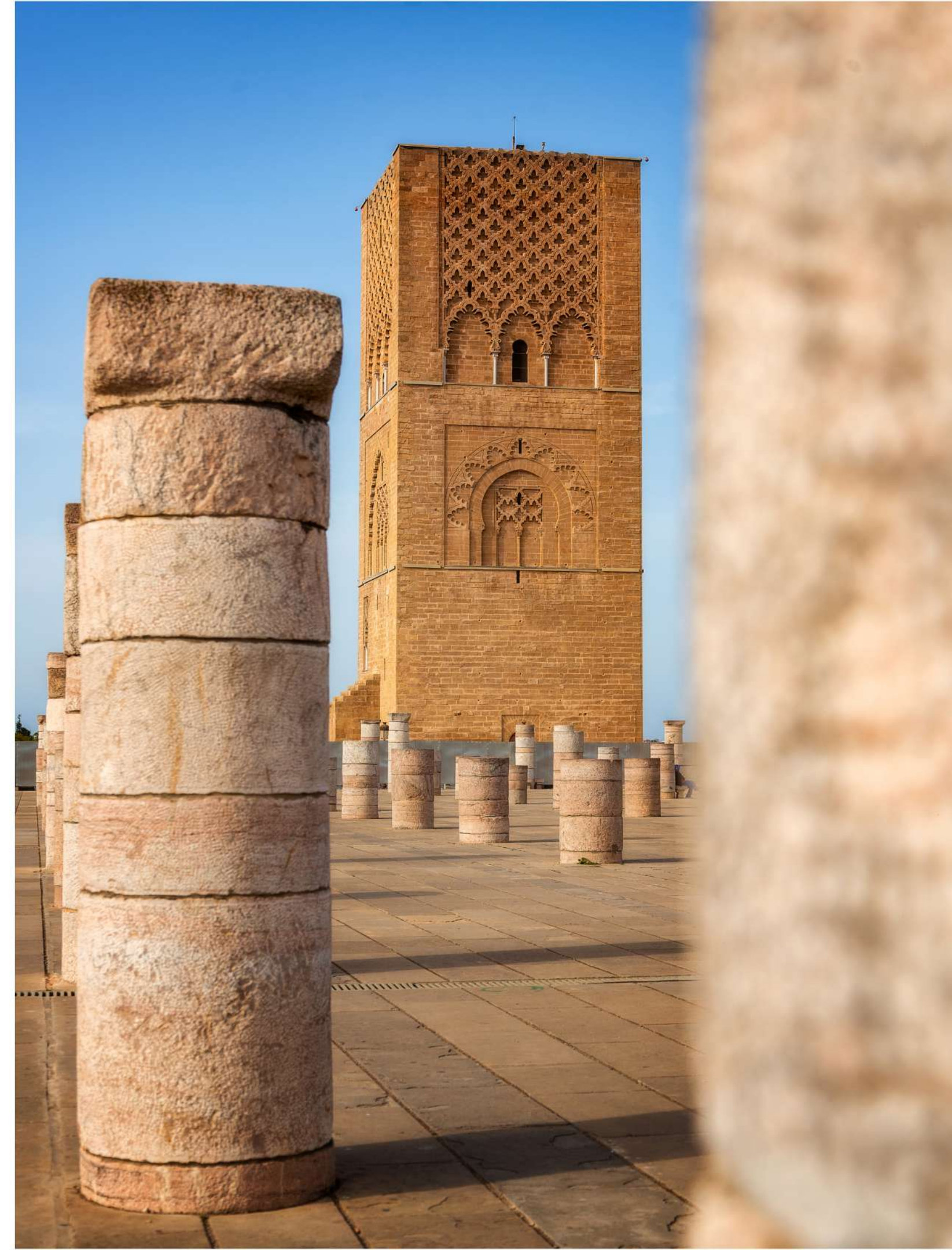


DAY 5

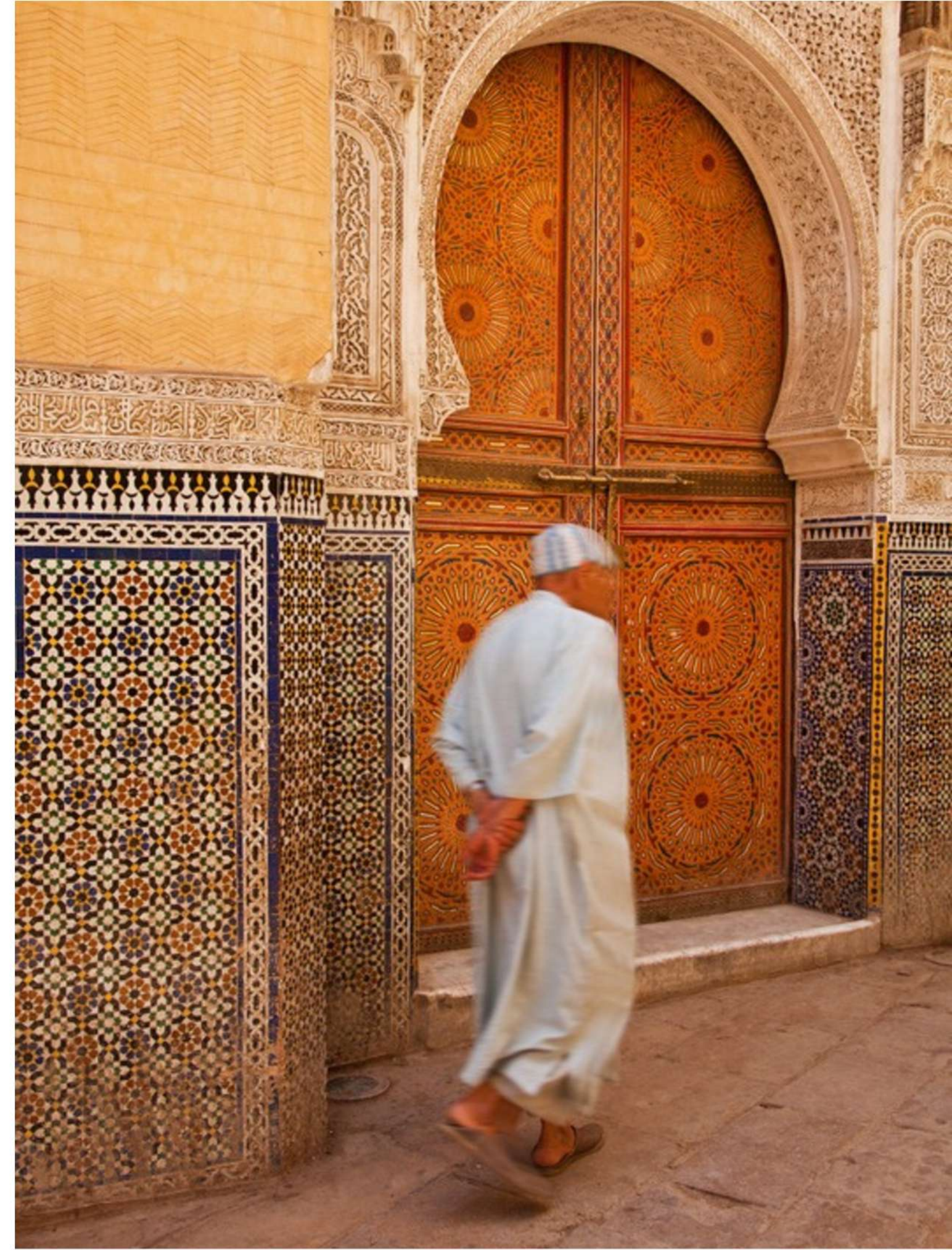

Marrakesh is really two cities standing side by side - the old town within its historic walls and the new town with its districts of Gueliz and l'Hivernage. The city covers a good deal of ground, and is ideal for exploring on foot, by bicycle or by barouche, the traditional Marrakchi way of getting from one place to another.

The Majorelle Garden, Arsat Moulay Abdessalam Park, the gardens of the Bahia Palace, and the Menara and Agdal orchards - each, in its own unique way, a haven of peace, relaxation, and pure delight! The city with a thousand years of history has seen 5 dynasties, each one leaving their indelible mark on its destiny.

It was founded in 1062 by the Almoravids, whose greatest legacy was to bring water to the city, harnessing spring waters through an ingenious system of wells and piping networks. We owe them the city's Palmeraie, its gardens and orchards, and the many other amenities that led to its development and influence. Under their rule, Marrakesh became the capital of Morocco.

The monuments included are indicated as information. In case of exceptional closure of one of the monuments, it will be replaced by another of equivalent level.

Kindly note that once confirmed, entrance tickets to the Majorelle Garden, the Berber Museum, and the Yves Saint Laurent Museum are non-changeable and non-refundable.
